<b>Abortion:</b> Mostly ban or mostly legal?	<a href="#">Ban all abortions after 20 weeks.</a>	Legal. <a href="#">“These personal decisions are between a woman and her doctor.”</a>
<b>Campaign Finance:</b> Require political ads to disclose their largest funders?	No. <a href="#">Voted against bill to require this.</a>	Yes. <a href="#">Co-sponsored bill to require this.</a>
<b>Campaign Finance:</b> Support <i>Citizens United</i> decision, allowing unlimited political donations from corporations and unions?	Unclear. <a href="#">Has called for end of corporate &amp; union donations, but not for overturning decision.</a>	No. <a href="#">Supports constitutional amendment to overturn decision.</a>
<b>Climate Change:</b> Consider climate change a critical threat?	No. <a href="#">“Impact from humans is up for debate.”</a>	Yes. <a href="#">“Climate change isn’t just a threat to our environment, it’s a threat to our national security.”</a>
<b>Climate Change:</b> Limit or tax production of greenhouse gases? Support President Trump’s withdrawal from Paris Climate Agreement?	No to limit or tax. <a href="#">Voted to bar EPA from limiting greenhouse gasses.</a> Supported withdrawal from Paris Climate Agreement, saying US would still keep developing <a href="#">“innovative new energy technologies that make our state and our nation’s energy supply cleaner, more affordable, and more reliable.”</a>	Yes to tax or limit. <a href="#">Opposed repeal of Obama Clean Power Plan, saying would “increase carbon pollution, worsen the effects of climate change, and slow down our transition to a clean energy economy.”</a> Opposed withdrawal from Paris Climate Agreement.
<b>Contraception:</b> Employers can withhold contraceptive coverage from employees if disagree with it morally?	<a href="#">Yes.</a>	No. <a href="#">Cosponsored bill to prevent this.</a>
<b>Courts:</b> Support President Trump’s choice of <a href="#">Brett Kavanaugh for Supreme Court?</a> (Before allegations).	Yes, would likely vote to confirm. <a href="#">“I have no reservations.”</a>	No. <a href="#">“Right now I can’t see myself voting yes.”</a>
<b>Economy:</b> Support federal spending as a means of promoting economic growth?	No. <a href="#">“Control wasteful spending and shrink the size of government.”</a>	Yes. <a href="#">“Invest in things that create jobs-- like our energy and transportation infrastructure, public and technical schools, and high-tech research.”</a>
<b>Education:</b> Public support for parents sending their children to private schools?	Yes. <a href="#">Backed tax savings plan to help parents pay for private schools.</a>	No. <a href="#">Public money should go to public schools.</a>
<b>Gay Marriage:</b> Support gay marriage?	Personal belief: “traditional marriage.” Will respect Supreme Court decision.	Yes.
<b>Gun Control:</b> Support more restrictive gun control legislation? Restrict semi-automatic assault rifles?	Historically no. <a href="#">Voted against banning high-capacity magazines and expanded background checks. Now would leave gun regulation to states.</a>	Yes. <a href="#">Ban high-capacity magazines and military-style assault rifles.</a>

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<b>Healthcare:</b> Support or Repeal Affordable Care Act (ACA), known as Obamacare?	<a href="#">Mostly repeal. Voted for several repeal measures, though against at least one. Prefers block grants to the states.</a>	<a href="#">Supports ACA but would like to add public option and chance to buy into existing Medicaid programs</a>
<b>Healthcare:</b> Allow Planned Parenthood public funds for non-abortion health services?	<a href="#">Twice voted against funding, but more recently says will protect it.</a>	Yes.
<b>Healthcare:</b> Require people to work to receive Medicaid?	Cosponsored bill allowing states to impose work requirements.	No.
<b>Immigration:</b> Support DACA, allowing “Dreamers” who arrived illegally as children, then grew up in the US, to achieve legal status if meet certain conditions?	<a href="#">Mixed positions.</a> Called original DREAM Act a “backdoor amnesty” program, and voted against. Supported a recent DACA extension. <a href="#">Opposed recent bill with path to citizenship</a> , though open to concept, depending on specifics.	Yes. <a href="#">Co-sponsored DREAM Act.</a> Also general earned path to citizenship <a href="#">“for law-abiding undocumented immigrants who are playing by the rules and contributing to our economy.”</a> So potential earned path for more than just DACA recipients.
<b>Iran:</b> Support Trump withdrawal from multinational treaty limiting Iran’s nuclear capability while lifting economic sanctions?	Yes.	No.
<b>Marijuana:</b> Prohibit federal government from interfering with state marijuana legalization or decriminalization?	Unclear. <a href="#">Personally opposed but respects will of voters. Asked federal government to consult with Nevada’s governor before taking federal action, but hasn’t sponsored STATES Act.</a>	<a href="#">Yes, co-sponsored STATES Act to do this.</a> Also a bill to regulate federally like alcohol.
<b>Minimum Wage:</b> Raise the federal minimum wage?	No. <a href="#">Opposed 2014 vote to increase to \$8.25 an hour.</a>	Yes. <a href="#">Raise to \$15 an hour.</a>
<b>Net Neutrality:</b> Require internet providers to provide equal access to all users?	No. <a href="#">“Want there to be more competition.”</a>	Yes. <a href="#">Eliminating protections for broadband users puts consumers at risk</a>
<b>President Trump:</b> <a href="#">Percentage of key votes</a> supporting Trump positions.	92% on Senate votes as of 8/27/18.	42% on House votes as of 8/27/18.
<b>Privatization:</b> Support full or partial privatization of Social Security and/or VA?	Position unclear.	<a href="#">Opposes both.</a>
<b>Renewable Energy:</b> Support government subsidies for renewable energy? (Both Heller and Rosen oppose Trump’s tariffs on imported solar panels).	Mixed. <a href="#">Has supported some renewable energy bills, opposed other key votes. Recently supported extending credits.</a>	Yes. Strong supporter.
<b>Student debt:</b> Refinance student loans at lower rates, paid for by increasing taxes on high earners (Elizabeth Warren bill).	No. <a href="#">Voted against.</a> Cosponsored separate bill supporting counseling about financial aid choices.	Wasn’t in House during Warren bill. <a href="#">Has supported refinancing if market rates drop. Also supports extending Perkins program and letting student loans be cancelled if recipients go bankrupt.</a>
<b>Taxes:</b> Support <a href="#">President Trump’s tax cut bill</a> ?	Yes <a href="#">“I helped write it!” Believes the bill “provides critically important tax cuts to Nevada’s middle-class families, boosts job creation, and spurs economic growth.”</a>	No. Considers <a href="#">“fraudulent” handout to corporations and the wealthiest. Opposes top bracket and corporate tax cuts that she considers at the heart of the bill.</a>
